

Believe me, it takes longer to find someone else (who is probably already working) to tell them about a problem that it would to just fix something yourself. Please make that extra effort.
- 7. During the Cyclone, try to meet as many people as you can and welcome them. Then, take some mental notes of different things you hear from our friends. You may pick up a tidbit that can make our party next year! Remember, our goal is to put on the absolute best party.
